We are seeking an experienced and skilled HLTA to work across both sites with a main base at Rush Hill Site, Bath.

Job Purpose

- To assist in the teaching of a range of school subjects and assist in the development of certain areas of those subjects (e.g. literacy interventions/reading programmes)
- To plan and lead on the delivery of Arts and Crafts across Lansdown Park Academy (Rush Hill)
- To deliver and develop enrichment subjects to small groups of pupils
- To undertake the pastoral support for pupils in a class.
- To support the Behaviour Policy throughout the school.
- To contribute to developing social skills, raising self-esteem and encouraging the personal progress of all pupils in all activities.
