Information for schools

The PAL system has been developed by the council in partnership with Bristol schools and will last until 2021. It includes two lists of approved providers:

- Full-time and revolving door
- Part-time

All full-time placements, including revolving door placements, into alternative provision should be agreed in advance by a Bristol Inclusion Panel (BIP). The placement will then be arranged via the council's ALP Hub with a provider on the full-time list.

Schools will make their own arrangements for part-time alternative learning and may use providers who are on either the full-time or part-time list.

Schools should refer to the most up to date version of this PAL System Catalogue for current details of each provider's service offer including any specialisms and suitability criteria, pricing and contact details.

This catalogue will be regularly updated as new providers join the PAL system or existing providers vary their offer.

¹ Some providers have been assessed as posing a high financial risk based on an analysis of their accounts, but have been accepted onto the PAL system as this risk is mitigated where they have a specific part-time offer with potentially low contract value and little risk of disruption to education. Any potential financial risk is further mitigated because purchasers are able to pay in arrears.

Quality scores

Full time providers have been given an overall quality score (satisfactory, good or excellent) based on their initial assessment when joining the PAL system and any subsequent performance reviews. Any providers who fail to meet the ongoing quality criteria may be removed from the PAL system.

The Bristol City Council ALP Hub will coordinate quality assurance for all provision that it purchases, and for other full-time alternative learning provision in partnership with schools.

These short courses run for 90 minutes a week for 6 consecutive weeks usually over a school term sessions are run during the day in either am or pm sessions.

InterHigh provides a full curriculum and pastoral support delivering a highly engaging, interactive environment for pupils enabling them to develop their learning and social skills within a safe, controlled setting.

Our uniquely flexible delivery model circumvents a range of barriers to learning enabling pupils to enjoy good levels of school attendance and make excellent progress. Personalised curricula can be delivered on a stage-not-age basis where class groups are organised around learning needs without any of the potential social or organisational issues this might otherwise present.

At InterHigh all lessons are live and taught by professionally qualified teachers in an online classroom setting. Class sizes are a maximum of 18 pupils in KS3/4 and 12 in KS5. The classroom provides an interactive whiteboard and teachers and pupils communicate by voice and instant messaging. Individual, paired, group and whole-class activities can be undertaken and all pupils can discretely contact the teacher at any time.

Complementing this are a range of clubs, societies, teacher led activities and a school social media platform that provides a broader social setting. Additionally, the entire school curriculum and lesson recordings are held in our structured, searchable and accessible school library.

St Matthias Park is a small secondary provision with bases in the East & Central and North localities of the city. This Pupil Referral Unit is a revolving door provision for pupils who have experienced difficulties in mainstream school and whose educational and learning experiences have left them feeling disillusioned and negative about education.

Supported by a dedicated, skilful and committed staff team, including curriculum subject leaders who are all experienced qualified teachers, young people successfully move on from St Matthias Park. We run highly supervised developmental courses in Motor Vehicle Repair and Road Safety for groups of 6-8 students. Each group will have exclusive use of our premises.
